



Roles and Responsibility of ICC Representatives

(Twin Cities/In-Person)

ICC representatives commit to full participation in the ICC and must be available for in-person meetings in the Twin Cities metro area at least twice per month. Specifically, ICC representatives commit to:

- Attend ICC orientation in Minneapolis on Saturday, October 14, from 12pm 4:30pm at the Northeast Library Meeting Room, 2200 Central Ave NE, Minneapolis, MN 55418
- Attend ALL monthly ICC meetings and committee meetings. ICC full council meetings will be held from 3:30pm 5:30pm on the second Thursday of each month beginning in November. Each committee will also meet once monthly outside of the full council meeting.
- **Devote an average of 2-4 hours per week outside of meetings to ICC-related service.** This amount of time may vary depending on your committee, whether you hold a leadership position, and upcoming events.
- Participate in the Martin Luther King, Jr. Day of Service and AmeriCorps Week.
- Attend a MINIMUM of three ICC events (service projects, trainings, and/or social events) outside of Martin Luther King, Jr. Day of Service and AmeriCorps Week.
- Be the primary ICC liaison to your AmeriCorps cohort and promote events accordingly.

Roles and Responsibility of ICC Ambassadors

(Greater MN/Remote)

The InterCorps Council of Minnesota offers ambassador positions for AmeriCorps members who, due to distance from the Twin Cities, are unable to participate fully as ICC representatives. Specifically, ICC ambassadors commit to:

- Call into ambassador introductory conference call and welcome on Tuesday, 10/17, Noon –
 1pm, call details forthcoming.
- Participate in a monthly conference call to provide input on and be informed about the ICC's work.
- **Devote an average of 2-4 hours per month to ICC-related service** in addition to the monthly conference call. This amount of time may vary depending on the time of year.
- Organize, promote, and participate in local service projects for the Martin Luther King, Jr. Day of Service and AmeriCorps Week. Coordinate these projects with other AmeriCorps members in your area and fellow ICC representatives and ambassadors.
- Serve as a point of contact for AmeriCorps members in your region interested in connecting with other AmeriCorps members.
- Make at least one presentation about AmeriCorps to a college or other community audience during the year.
- Organize and participate in other service projects, training events, and/or social events with other AmeriCorps members in your region, as appropriate, depending on members' locations.
- Be the primary ICC liaison to your AmeriCorps cohort and other AmeriCorps members in your region and promote ICC events accordingly.
